CTC Conducts Strategy Session to Define Future Focus

Toronto, ON – June 17, 2024 – The Canadian Tamil Congress (CTC) hosted a pivotal meeting on Saturday, bringing together members, board of directors and advisors for a full-day session aimed at charting the organization's strategic direction for the next five years.

The session was facilitated by dedicated community members and involved an extensive SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) analysis, followed by breakout discussions. These discussions focused on identifying and prioritizing CTC's role in Canada and Sri Lanka, and exploring effective ways to engage with the broader Canadian Tamil community.

This consultation process will ensure that the diverse voices and needs of the Tamil community are effectively represented in CTC's initiatives.
